# Sydney Jewish Museum, Jews from Islamic lands: Stories of tradition, displacement and survival from the Rivers of Babylon to the shores of Australia. HIS SYD

This book reflects the exhibition held at the Sydney Jewish Museum. Until the 15th century, most Jews lived in Islamic lands. The exhibition traced the lives of Jews living in the Middle East, Asia Minor, North Africa and the Iberian Peninsula from ancient times. It tells a tapestry of stories from across these regions, of flourishing, tolerance, expulsion and displacement, as well as how these Jews have continued to celebrate their vibrant cultures in new places across the world. This exhibition tells the stories of Jews from Islamic lands through objects from the Sydney Jewish Museum's collection and those sourced from local families with direct lineage from these regions.

Each chapter of the book deals with a separate modern Jewish problem. In each chapter there are stories and examples by means of which the problem itself is illustrated, and a number of interesting questions for you to think about.
